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## From the Principal



Dear Parents/ Carers, Staff and Students.

A belated welcome back to Term 3! It has been a whirlwind first four weeks of the term infused with the spirit of

the Olympics and our very own Dara Olympic competitions. Our College Leaders have been outstanding in leading a range of initiatives in their portfolio areas. Congratulations to our Sport Captain, Lara Dau, for her vision for the Dara Olympics and the House Captains for bringing together their Houses in the 'friendly' rivalry and competition that took place. Congratulations also to our Environment Captain, Gemma Weller, and the Environment Group for the Handmade Sustainable Market Day

It has been wonderful for our students and staff to finally be able to access and have their classes in our Issoudun Performing Arts building. Over the recent holiday break, the Performing Arts Staff and the Music Office relocated to the office spaces in Issoudun. I know that the bands and ensembles have enjoyed the acoustics of the performing spaces compared to McCowage Hall. Rehearsals and preparations have begun in the theatre and drama spaces in the lead up to the first production early next term in the Joe Woodward Theatre.

At the beginning of the term, I had the privilege of joining our Year 12 students at Stanwell Tops on their final Reflection Camp at Daramalan. I was overwhelmed by the positivity of the students and their engagement in all of the sessions. The College Leaders also provided an update on each of their portfolios and the events and activities for the term ahead. At the conclusion of the assembly, we were able to take our annual Heart Photo, which had been postponed due to the weather on Sacred Heart Day.

Already this term, the Daramalan Dance Company have performed in the Wakakirri National Story-Dance Festival

for Schools at the Canberra Theatre. The performance by the Dance Company students, 'Belonging to Broadway', received a State Award and they have been invited to perform at the Awards Showcase night at the end of the month. Their performance was outstanding, and I look forward to seeing them perform later in the month. Thank you to Ms Jess Haynes, Ms Elisha Smyth and Ms Annette Brady for the hours of rehearsals that they have supervised in the lead up to the performance. A huge thanks also to Mr Matt Maggs for accompanying the students on the day and also to our Maintenance team for their transport of the sets and costumes.

Our Year 9 and Year 11 students have begun the discernment process as to whether they will put themselves forward for a formal leadership position in 2025. Our Year 11 students participated in their Leadership Day last week where they came together as a cohort and then in House groups to consider just what they believe are the qualities of a leader in an MSC school such as Daramalan. The day was facilitated by Burn Bright and I would like to commend the students for their approach to the day and their engagement with the activities.

We have also commenced our Year Group Masses this term, with our Year 11 and 7 students already celebrating the Eucharist together. Year 10 will have their Mass in Week 6, Year 9's Mass will be held in Week 8 and Year 8 will celebrate their Mass in Week 9. I would like to thank Fr Tru Nguyen MSC for celebrating our Masses with us, Ms Cheryl Hamill for her preparation, College Mission Captain Isaac Arthur for his poignant reflection at each of the Masses, and to all of the students who have volunteered as readers or for other roles during the Masses.







Thank you to those families who continue to follow our request to keep their student at home if they are showing any of the signs or symptoms associated with colds and flu and Covid-19. Unfortunately, Influenza and Covid-19 continues to be present in our community. As was mentioned to the students at our Assembly in Week 1, it is doing the small things, like staying at home if you are unwell that can keep us all safe and healthy. We have a number of staff and students in our immediate community who are immunocompromised in addition to those in our wider community and families.

#### **Student Leave requests**

A reminder for families that should a student need to be away for 5 or more school days for reasons other than sickness, prior approval from the Principal must be sought in writing via a letter or an email. This includes where a student is absent due to their participation in representative sporting teams and competitions. The request needs to be submitted in sufficient time so that arrangements regarding missed schoolwork and assessment can be made. Students in Years 11 and 12 should be aware that there are strict requirements for attendance stipulated by the ACT Board of Senior Secondary Studies in order for students to gain credit for a unit of work. Any extended absences from school may have an impact on the student's ability to be assessed even if all the assessment tasks for the unit are

completed. Students should seek advice from the Assistant Principal Curriculum Years 11-12, **Mr Steven Carroll**, prior to making plans to miss any school days.

## Parking, Blocking Driveway Access, No Stopping Zones and Supporting Student Safety

Families will have noticed that Access Canberra has increased the placement of speed monitoring vans and signage around the College since the beginning of this term. As I mentioned in Daranews at the end of last term, I have been notified by Access Canberra that they will continue to monitor speeding and parking by mobile speed vans and licence plate recognition vehicles around the College over the coming weeks. Unsafe and illegal parking can reduce visibility of our students and motorists to see each other, creating a significant hazard when students cross the road. Please remember not to park across pedestrian crossings, in no stopping zones, on corners, verges or double parking.

I would like to reiterate my previous requests that people who are dropping off their students in the morning, and/ or picking up students in the afternoon do not park on the nature strips of houses near the College or across driveway entrances. Unfortunately, we continue to receive complaints from our neighbours about damage done to grass and trees as well as access being blocked when they have attempted to exit or enter their property. We wish to maintain positive relationships with our neighbours, so we ask that you assist by respecting their space and their requests in relation to access to their properties. Please also be mindful when picking up students that you are not parked or stopping in a designated bus zone or a signposted no parking/stopping area.



## From the Counselling Hub

#### The Close Link Between Mental Health and Nutrition

Recent studies have concluded that 90 percent of Serotonin and Dopamine are found in the gut. These neurotransmitters, commonly known as chemical messengers, are relevant in our everyday life because they define how we feel, behave and carry out our physical and mental activities.

The connection between gut and brain is a two-way street. For example, an empty stomach with a low amount of nutrients will send less and ineffective signals to your brain. As a result, the person may experience compromised performance, increased anxiety, irritability, mood fluctuations, intense and negative emotional reactions, decreased enthusiasm, reduced motivation, lack of concentration, low comprehension and problem solving, etc...

If you experience any of these symptoms, it would be worth paying attention to what and how you are eating, because eating low-nutritious foods may influence your levels of anxiety and stress.

Imagine that you have a long day, full of activities, exams, many classes to attend and you need to do your best performance, experts recommend starting with a good breakfast, cereals with a lot of fibre and protein. Consider opting for foods rich in probiotics such as yogurt, and high in fibre, such as fruits and vegetables. If you need further information, visit the additional links below.

Equally important is developing your Interoception Skills - for example, have you ever felt your stomach growl? Your head pound? Your heart race? Your palms sweat? Your eyes grow heavy? If so, do you know how you are able to **feel these feels**? Many people notice these feelings in their body with the help of this important sense called Interoception - often referred to as our 8th sense.


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

## **Year 12 Reflection Camp**



## Rail Safety Week

## Stop Look and Listen, and don't let yourself become a target!

#### **Rail Safety Week Design Competition 2024**

Year 11 and 12 Design and Graphics students were provided an excellent opportunity during Semester 1. Canberra Metro approached the school to see if students studying Design and Graphics would be interested in participating in a competition with Dickson College and Gungahlin College to design a Light Rail safety awareness poster and a matching design for a Light Rail Vehicle printed vinyl wrap which would be displayed on the side of the Light Rail Vehicles for 12 months. So, the students set to work designing their own inspiring message about safety around the Light Rail network in the ACT.

Year 11 students did this as their Major Practical Assessment for Semester 1, while as this was the first year participating in the competition, Year 12 students were given the option of designing for the competition. One of our Year 12 students took advantage of the offer.

Through the duration of the project, they worked closely with a representative from Canberra Metro, **Sally Coyle**, and Transit Graphics representative, **John Mikita**. They provided ongoing feedback, design assistance and advice to the students at multiple key points through the project. ## Science

#### Year 7 Classification

Year 7 dove into the wild world of classifying living things this term—turns out, there's more to life than just "cute" and "creepy."



#### **Year 9 Survival Museum**

To finish our unit on survival of the species, our Year 9 students created Daramalan's first Survival Museum. In small groups they researched a unique animal or plant species to increase their understanding of the mechanisms that facilitate reproduction and survival.

From the dazzling dances of birds to the mesmerising movements of insects, students explored a diverse array of courting rituals. They examined the fascinating world of pollination, learning how plants attract and utilise pollinators like bees, butterflies and birds to ensure the continuation of their species.

After intensive research, students showcased their findings through creative and informative displays. These displays included detailed diagrams, models, dioramas, and even multimedia presentations, bringing the wonders of nature to life.

















Year 10 Science

Why do Year 10 Chemistry students like telling jokes about the Periodic Table? Because they always get a reaction!!

Year 10 Chemistry students are learning all about the reactivity of elements on the Periodic Table. They witnessed Sodium make a splashy entrance in water (literally), with an explosive demo that made them all jump. Students have used model sets to create compounds that show bonding between atoms—basically LEGO for future Nobel Prize winners!









## Science Cont...

#### Year 11 Biology

In Year 11 Biology, students tested for biomacromolecules, which are essential molecules for life, including carbohydrates, proteins, lipids and nucleic acids. They conducted various chemical tests, such as the Benedict's test for sugars, the Biuret test for proteins, and the Sudan III test for lipids, to identify these molecules in different samples. Applying their practical skills, students participated in a murder mystery activity where they analysed 'stomach contents' of a victim. By identifying the biomacromolecules present, they could determine the victim's last meal.








#### Year 12 Biology Homer-stasis

In Year 12 Biology, students performed an experiment about homeostasis, the process by which living organisms maintain a stable internal environment despite changes in external conditions. The class conducted an engaging experiment where they had to manage the homeostatic functions of a fictional character named Homer. Through this interactive activity, students learned about the importance of regulating factors like temperature, water balance and glucose levels to keep Homer alive and healthy.







**Big Science Competition Results**

This 50-minute, multiple choice online competition tests Science knowledge, critical-thinking and problem-solving skills. Questions are set in real-life, contemporary contexts, making them relatable... and interesting!

Why are Artists drawn to creating artworks of everyday things such as bowls of fruit and inanimate objects?

Still Life is a genre of Art that has been explored since ancient times and found everywhere from Egyptian tombs to Ancient Greek mosaics to Modernist canvas paintings. These artworks show us what kinds of foods were eaten by different cultures at different times throughout history. Vanitas, a Northern European 16th/17th C sub-genre of Still Life explored ideas of life and death and spoke about the misguided tendency to place too much importance on materialism. These paintings included rotting fruit, snuffedout candles and skulls.

The American Pop Artist Wayne Thiebaud was besotted with the highly organised and beautifully presented cake displays he saw in his neighbourhood and became incredibly famous for his paintings of these delicious treats. In Semester 1, Year 9 students learnt how to oil paint and were asked to embrace Thiebaud's love of all things sugary. They made and decorated their own cakes and through the process of photographing their creations, they learnt about composition and lighting. Their final oil paintings used their photographs as reference images and are a representation of our time and place and the things we enjoy eating.

Mr John Vukovic's Year 7 Artists have transformed ordinary clay into extraordinary keepsakes. Their Hermannsburg pots are more than just artworks; they are tangible memories of cherished family moments. Each piece tells a unique story, capturing the laughter, love and shared experiences that will be treasured for generations.




















## **Performing Arts**


I also interviewed Daramalan's Dance teacher, **Ms Jessica Haynes** about what followed:

The Girls 7-8 team started with a tough loss to Burgmann but bounced back in the second game with a tightly fought victory over CGGS.


