From the Principal



Dear Parents/ Carers, Staff and Students.

Abelated welcome back to Term 3! Whilst we are still in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic and the cold and flu season is still with us, the term has begun with

a flurry of activity and events. I am constantly in awe at the diverse gifts, talents and generosity that exists within our community. Many of the activities that have taken place over the past few weeks, and those that are planned for the coming weeks, you will read about in this edition of Daranews. We were able to acknowledge the achievements of a number of our students at our Opening Assembly during Week 1 including eight of our students who received Principal's Awards acknowledging their Australian Representation across a variety of sports, along with recognising Ethics Olympiad participants. Being able to gather as a community is a real privilege in these times. The myriad of opportunities available to our students don't just happen, so I would like to thank all of the staff who have been involved and have given so generously of their time. Thank you also to our families, I am very aware that without your support (and often your endless taxi services) there would be no students to take up these opportunities. We currently have a number of our students representing the ACT in a variety of sporting competitions taking place all over Australia. We wish them all much success in their respective competitions.

This week I have had the privilege to witness two of these diverse opportunities first hand. On Tuesday our Robotics Club students hosted a VEX Robotics Scrimmaging Competition here at the College where we welcomed students from Goulburn High for a regional competition. This event involved teams building complex robotic systems and then competing against other teams for overall points. The team work, generosity, and collaboration that was evident across teams from both schools was a testament to the

On Tuesday evening I then had the pleasure of attending the Wakakirri National Story-Dance Festival for Schools at the Canberra Theatre. The performance by the Daramalan Dance Company students was uplifting and of the highest standard. I could not keep the smile from my face (behind my mask) for the entirety of their performance. Thank you to Ms Lucy Cronan and Ms Louise Chapman for the hours of rehearsals that they have supervised in the lead up to the performance.



However, it not just our students who are doing outstanding things with a number of our staff being recognised for their work both inside and out of the classroom recently. Mrs Kate O'Connor has achieved Lead Teacher status after a rigorous process through the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL) and the ACT Teacher Quality Institute. Ms Bianca Ross and Ms Heike Craig travelled to Germany in the most recent holiday period after being awarded scholarships through the Goethe Institute to undertake intensive study there. The College Teacher Librarians, Ms Brownyn Milgate, Ms Trish Templeton and Ms Maree Marceau were invited to present at the National Education Summit in Melbourne last term, whilst Ms Melinda Cashman presented at the English Literacy Educators Conference held during the recent break in Darwin. Mr Ben McGee has been appointed as the Assistant Coach for the Australian Schoolboys Rugby Union team, and Mr Angus Balmaks is the current coach for the ACT Schoolboys Rugby Union squad. Mr Seth Stoltenberg is currently the coach of the ACT Open Girls Rugby Union Squad and Ms Elana Sliwinski is their manager. In addition to these staff, we have a number of staff who are currently undertaking further Masters and Doctoral Studies and others who are members of Course Writing panels for the ACTBSSS, in addition

to attending conferences and other professional learning activities.

Our Year 9 and Year 11 students have begun the discernment process as to whether they will put themselves forward for a formal leadership position in 2023. Our Year 11 students participated in their Leadership Day on Monday where they came together as a cohort and then in House groups to consider just what they believe are the qualities of a leader in an MSC school such as Daramalan. The day was facilitated by Burn Bright and I would like to commend the students for their approach to the day and their engagement with the activities.

Next Friday, the College will be holding our House Athletics Carnival which was postponed from Term 1. Can I remind families that this is a compulsory school day for all students and there are a variety of competitive and non-competitive events for them to participate in. Should the weather be inclement on the day and the carnival cancelled, families will be notified and a Day 2 Timetable operate. These are always wonderful days where our community and House spirit come to the fore.

We have also commenced our Year group Masses this term, with our Year 11 and 7 students already celebrating the Eucharist together. I would like to thank Fr Kimi Vunivesilevu MSC for celebrating our Masses with us, Ms Carlie Dwyer for her preparation, College Mission Captain Antonella Simunic for her poignant reflection at each of the Masses, and to all of the students who have volunteered as readers or for other roles during the Masses.



Thank you to those families who continue to follow our request to keep their student at home if they are showing any of the signs or symptoms associated with colds and flu, and of course, Covid-19. As was mentioned to the students at our Assembly in Week 1, it is doing the small things, like staying at home if you are unwell, wearing a mask on public transport or in crowded spaces, and using the hand sanitiser that is available in all classrooms, that can keep us all safe and healthy. We are continuing to follow our protocols established at the beginning of the year in relation to families completing the online notification form on Daranet for positive Covid-19 cases and close contacts.

Travelling Safely to and from the College

The return to school has highlighted the need for us to remind all students about keeping themselves and others safe as they travel to and from school. We would appreciate it if all families could have a conversation with their students about the following please:

- The need to not engage with strangers in cars and to never go near a vehicle driven by a stranger if encouraged to do so.

About the production:







Music



ASC swimming



- All of your tuition fees paid for the three or four years of your degree (no HELP debt at the completion of your studies).
- Financial support for the purchase of textbooks and other required study items.
- Up to 12 weeks of professionally recognised, paid work experience in the Department of Defence.
- In your final year, you will be required to apply for an ongoing position on the Defence Graduate Program (DGP) as part of a merit based selection process. Successful applicants will be offered a permanent ongoing position and will commence on the program following the successful completion of their degree.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the DCUS you must:

- be an Australian citizen;
- have not previously enrolled in an engineering or computing degree;
- achieve a minimum ATAR of 85 for Engineering and 80 for Computing and Cyber Security;
- meet the UNSW admission and assumed knowledge requirements for a Bachelor of Engineering or Computing and Cyber Security; and
- $\boldsymbol{-}$ be prepared to relocate at your own cost to Canberra for the full three or four year study period.


